Curriculum/Professional Development Planning/Programming

- The school level plans for both Lathrop Street and Choconut Valley elementary schools are in draft form and will be completed after our building level committees meet to review the data and our preliminary findings. The goal of the committee is to add value to the process by contributing to the development of the building level goals as they relate to Title I Federal Programs guidelines.
- Interviews have been conducted for several positions throughout the district. We have been fortunate to have a nice amount of quality applicants.
- I have been meeting with representatives from various companies via zoom to continue the science CAT cycle.
- Preparations for the opening in-service days are underway. We have scheduled several trainings and quality opportunities for grade levels to prepare for the 22-23 school year.
- Letters requesting proposals for the PCCD mental health professional have been sent to various agencies. We are hoping to find a highly qualified candidate to assist in providing mental health and counseling services to our students at Choconut Valley.
- I will be attending a three-day conference in Harrisburg next week to learn about the changes to Federal Programs guidelines. This will include updates related to the ESSER I, ESSER II, and ARP ESSER monitoring procedures that will be implemented in the 22-23 school year.

- Thanks to Chris Black for his work in the high school, and his efforts to get the building ready for a new school year while also transitioning to Choconut Valley. Thanks to Mr. Lonzinski and the summer crew for making such good progress with summer cleaning. A Special thanks to Miss Ashley Miller for her help coordinating and overseeing our student workers.
- Thanks to Mrs. Erin Giannone for providing summer school support opportunities, in-person and online, to our Summer School students over a 6-week period.

II. <u>ANNOUNCEMENTS:</u>

- We will soon be back in school and fall sports practices begin on Monday August 8. We will need to work around the progress being made on the baseball field but are excited to see that project nearing completion. One consequence of the field work is that Coach Brewer needed to change the cross country course a bit. The course has been widened in multiple places and is going to be in great shape for the upcoming season. The slow but steady progress on the main gym floor will also cause a disruption to the volleyball team, but we can't wait to show off the newly refinished floor!
- Meet the teacher Nigh grades 7-12 is tentatively scheduled for Tuesday August 30 from 6-7:30pm, with 7th grade Orientation in the auditorium from 5:15-6:00. Those details will be sent home with student schedules in the near future.
- We are pleased to welcome Ariel Dudock, Michelle Martini and Heather Spry to the high school Special Education Department, and are excited to start a new year with these new employees.
- I would like to remind you that Mr. Alec Dragos, our Physics teacher, is the newest member of the Meteor family to participate in Project Lead the Way Training, and he is excited to be offering the new Principles of Engineering elective. Thanks to Mrs.

III. <u>CURRENT PROJECT STATUS:</u>

- The Junior/Senior High School master schedule is almost complete. Grades 7 and 8 are complete, and the high school schedule is set, pending resolving some conflicts for a number of students, identifying alternate electives, etc.
- Our Summer School program concluded July 29 and a number of students found success, many earning grades in the 80's and 90's. 10 of 15 students found success with Mrs. Palmiter's 8th grade math program; 10 of 11 passed the Personal Finance Course I facilitated through VLN; 11 of 22 other VLN-based courses were passed, a rate that is typical of summer school courses, with a much higher success rate when our own staff is involved.
- The Student Handbook is ready for your review. There are no substantive changes, apart from the usual editing process. We were able to add our Activity/Meteor Period and Assembly schedules back in and plan to make good use of them this year after a 2-year break.

For the past two years, the USDA has offered waivers to Child Nutrition (CN) Programs across the United States, allowing these programs to offer all students breakfast and lunch at no cost to you. Unfortunately, these waivers expired on June 30, 2022.

Starting next school year (22-23), CN programs across the nation will return to normal, pre-pandemic operations. Families will once again be asked to complete and submit a current school year Free/Reduced Meal Application if they would like to see if their students qualify based on income. In past years, the first 30 days of the school year carry over status from the previous school year. Since very few meal applications were submitted over the past two years, here is what you can do to ensure your child(s) is ready to start the 22-23 school year.

Breakfast costs \$1.25; lunch costs \$2.55. Your child(ren) may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. *Reduced price is \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch.*

The Stage in the High School Auditorium – Several Contractors have been in to review the project and we are awaiting recommendations and quotes at this time. Further updates will be posted as we move forward with this project.

Baseball Field Renovation Project at the Jr / Sr High School is in process. Final field grading is now complete, Drainage installation is now complete, currently the Infield Dirt is being installed, Infield Sod will be installed the week of 8/8/22, and then the Seeding of the outfield is scheduled for 8/25/22. The fencing Contractor will be finalizing the fence layout and Installation will be done in September. All work has been completed as expected and they are all doing an excellent Job!

With the field drainage installed, we have also added a 40 ft. collection trench and catch basin at the parking lot to Stadium entrance to collect rain water runoff. This trench will reduce the amount of washout that we have been experiencing under the stadium seating and onto the track below.

Gym Floors of all 3 Campuses – Choconut Elementary and Lathrop Street Elementary are now completed. The High School Gym Floor is currently in the painting phase and should be completed and drying within a few days. All Gyms will be available and ready to go by August 22, 2022.

Roofing project Updates:

High School – Work started as planned and has progressed very well. Weather has remained dry and the contractor has now completed about 65% of the roof to date. Wall panels for the upper section walls are scheduled to arrive the week of 8/8/22.

Lathrop Street – Work has now started. Removal and replacement will be 8 - 12 square a day and the goal is to have all demo work completed by the first day of school. Weather will decide if that will happen but weekend and working at night are options that will be used if necessary. Off to a good start so far.
