ADMINISTRATOR - Christine Kresge, Director of Curriculum and Instruction

BOARD MEETING DATE: Monday, June 9, 2022

Curriculum/Professional Development Planning/Programming

- A K-2 Meeting was held to discuss our MTSS process and prepare for next year. We are adding the Heggerty and Fundations programs to our kindergarten and first-grade classrooms to support early literacy. We will need to spend time preparing for these changes in the 2022-2023 school year.
- Our report card committee met to finalize our "wish list" and look at the electronic version of the report card. Grade 3 will start using focus for next year and will move to quarterly report cards. Grades K-2 will use Focus for report card purposes but will not use the grade book software.
- PSSA and Keystone exams were conducted, and the results have already arrived. Administration will navigate through the raw data and use it to evaluate our current progress and programming.
- An end-of-year site visit was conducted with Faith Mountain to discuss programming and goals from the past school year. They were asked to conduct a technology inventory related to the Chromebooks purchased through the ESSER funds.
- The process of writing the Federal Programs Consolidated Application, School Level Plans, and prepare for the Community Advisory meeting has started. These activities are essential for Federal Programs compliance.
- I have been working with vendors on the CAT cycle for science. Several meetings have occurred, and samples are starting to arrive. PDE has yet to approve the adoption of the new science standards, so we do not have all the information to move as aggressively as we would like.
- The process of completing staff evaluations is complete until the building level scores arrive in the fall.
- The Intervention team has successfully met their goals for 2021-2022 school year. We have already looked at end-of-year student data to determine lists of those who will require additional support in the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year.

The Stage in the High School Auditorium - We will be starting to demo the stage after school is out. With the old stage removed it will allow contractors to see what repairs will be necessary for proper replacement. Further updates will be posted as we move forward with this project.

Baseball Field Renovation Project at the Jr / Sr High School is scheduled to start on June 13th. Andre's will be coordinating the project and JP Reily construction will be doing the grade work. Our Maintenance Staff will be removing the old fence prior to other work starting. Up on completion of the grade work, Swift Fence will be installing the new perimeter fencing for the field.
