#### **Curriculum/Professional Development Planning/Programming**

- The school level plan for Choconut Valley has been approved by the Department of Federal Programs.
- Title I and math interventionists have reviewed their progress monitoring data and will continue to provide remedial services to students in both elementary schools and at the high school.
- Our annual Title I Parent and Family Engagement Nights at both Choconut and Lathrop St. Elementary schools were very successful! We had 25 families attend, which is a record number! Thank you to the Nutrition Group for providing pizza for dinner, Sarah Brander for making swag bags for all attendees, and Ryan Soden for organizing child care for the evening. A big THANK YOU to Christine Casey and Craig Owens for presenting to parents, Title I Reading teachers for attending the event, and the principals for your support.
- I attended and presented at the Curriculum Associates Mid-Atlantic Leadership Conference on October 26-28 in Philadelphia. The event was aimed at updating users on the newest tools and resources available to teachers and students. I presented on the topic of effective program implementation.
- As per our contract with vendors such as Curriculum Associates, MASD is currently owed multiple professional development sessions from various companies we are utilizing for instruction. Due to lack of substitutes, we cannot offer small group training and we lack in-service days to take advantage of these opportunities. Administration is looking for ways to provide teachers with the training they need.
- I attended the Federal Programs regional workshop on 11/4 to obtain the latest information on ESSER monitoring and Title programming. The ISP conference is scheduled for January in Pittsburgh. I will be taking two reading intervention teachers to this conference to focus on the topic of "The Science of Reading."

- We started the data meeting process in the elementary schools as I mentioned in my report last month. The first meetings were focused around creating norms and overall objectives. One group is already discussing students and having great conversations on goals and strategies. Our ultimate objective is to bring professional special education teachers together to brainstorm and facilitate an ongoing conversation around the progress of students with IEP's.
- 2. The new addition of our progress monitoring tool called Aimsweb has provided useful information not only in our data meetings but in our IEP meetings as well. The teachers continue to learn the tool but overall, I am happy with the information it is providing us.

The special education plan shall be developed every 3 years consistent with the 3-year review cycle of the strategic plan of the school district. The Secretary will prescribe the format, content, and time for submission of the special education plan. (§14.104(a))

#### **Facilities Report**

Lathrop Street Gym Floor Finish has started to peel from the floor. This is a similar issue to the High School Gym Floor with adhesion of the paint and finish. Flooring Company will be on site on December 26<sup>th</sup> to screen the floor, repaint the lines, and reapply the floor finish.

#### Roofing project Updates:

High School and Lathrop Street roof projects are now fully completed and the final inspections have been done. Final inspection reports will be sent soon. Any concerns during the inspections have already been addressed.

The overhead door to the IT Department was in very poor condition and either needed repairs or replacement. It was decided to remove the door and install a double steel door. We had the remaining opening filled in with block and brick. New doors were painted and installed. Interior of new block wall still needs to be painted to complete this project.

Patch Management came in to the High School and Choconut Elementary to Spray Patch our drive ways and parking lots. Many areas at each location have been fixed. Additional areas may need to be repaired next spring before any seal coating of the asphalt is completed.
